DEANNA SUE BRISTOW April Demonstration

I am a native central Californian. Born in San Luis Obispo, raised outside of Reedley and now living in the Sierra. The swath I've cut across the state provides me with a never ending reel of painting subjects. The landscape is incredible and the people entertaining.



My formal art education is an A. A. in art from Reedley College. I've since taken several workshops but the best teachers I've had were my own students. My earliest teaching experience was 9 year olds in Atascadero.

They had no fear, I told them to sit on the grass and draw that big old oak tree and they did. They trusted their eyes and drew what they saw and felt. An awesome experience.



I've always wanted to be an artist. I had dreams of working at the Disney Studio, painting on cels that would become an animated movie. Look at how animation had changed! I'm in awe of today's animated movies.

I now have a studio in my home. More accurately I should say my home is my studio as there is art stuff everywhere. The advantage to this environment is that I'm more likely to be distracted into my art rather than distracted by needed house work. Decidedly a happier way for me to live.

My current advice to artists during this pandemic situation is to take another look at YouTube. Artists and their organizations are flooding the channels with wonderful demonstrations and lessons. Online lessons from artists who charge a great deal of money for workshops, not to mention travel and housing, are now available at practical prices. Many of the larger art associations have their guest artists recorded. I have watched artists that I never thought to see (and some I've never heard of) as they give insights on their creative and technical processes. I don't get the benefit of learning from my fellow students like I would in a face to face event but I do reap the knowledge the instructor provides.

I will be painting with acrylic paints for my demonstration. I enjoy the speedy drying time of this medium and the flexibility it offers. I still use my value study sketches as the basis of my painting, some things don't change, no matter what the medium. ■

GENE BUTLER STUDENT ARTIST SCHOLARSHIPS

AREA HIGH SCHOOL ART INSTRUCTORS

The Clovis Art Guild, with the generous assistance of Allard's Art Supply, will again be providing an opportunity for your students to participate in the *Gene Butler High School Art Scholarship Program* during our 52nd Annual Old West & Rodeo Art Show — April 18 - 24. We encourage you to help us showcase our local student artists' works.

Teacher Responsibility:

- Selecting up to five students to participate with no more than two pieces per student.
- Assisting and insuring students are able to **submit their artwork** at receiving on **Saturday, April 16 from 10 AM to Noon** at the **Clovis Veterans Memorial District** located at 808 Fourth Street, Clovis.
- Assisting and insuring students pick up their artwork on Sunday, April 24 from 4 to 5 PM.
- Submitted works meet art criteria below.

Art Criteria:

- Student artwork has not been displayed in previous Clovis Art Guild shows.
- Each submitted piece must be framed and ready to hang. NOTE Along with the quality of their art, we expect students to learn how to professionally display and present their pieces. Professional guidelines can be found on our website (https://www.clovisartguild.com/framing--hanging-standards.php).
- Sculpture or 3-dimensional artwork **too large/heavy** to fit on a display table must have a **pedestal provided**.
- Each submitted piece must have an entry form attached to the back upper right corner with the following information:
 - Name of school
 - > Teacher's name and contact information (Email and/or phone number)
 - ➤ Student's name and contact information
 - Title of Artwork and Media used
- Entry forms are available on the CAG website (https://www.clovisartguild.com/GENE-BUTLER-SCHOLARSHIP.php).

Scholarships:

- Scholarships are divided equally among participating schools.
- Show judge will select at least one student piece from each participating school to receive a scholarship.
- Awarded scholarships will be acknowledged and handed out at the Artist Reception on Thursday, April 21 from 5 to 8 PM in the Community Room.

Teachers – please encourage your students to participate in all aspects (receiving, hanging, judging, viewing and reception) of our Show. Upon completing our application form, all participating students receive a FREE STUDENT MEMBERSHIP to the Clovis Art Guild entitling them to receive the CAG newsletter and free attendance to any art demonstration presented at our general meetings held 2nd Wednesdays of each month in the Clovis Veterans Center.
