THE ART OF MINDFULNESS & FINDING INTENTION

I just finished reading Jay Shetty's insightful book "Think Like a Monk". Jay spent 3 vears living in a monastery where he learned how to retrain his thoughts in order to live a more intentional. peaceful and happier life. He has taken these lessons and applied them to our current times to help others achieve the same results...

He uses a wonderful example of how to live more intentionally by using a **To Be** list instead of a **To Do** list. An example he gives is if you'd like to live financially free *your* To DO list might include updating your CV,

researching lucrative jobs, and applying for positions. Instead, Jay focuses on the qualities you need to be financially successful; your To BE list of discipline, focus, & passion to obtain that goal.

My To Do list as an artist includes creating work, providing marketing, sales, and customer service support, developing teaching techniques etc... but living intentionally as an artist I need To Be passionate, creative, a risk taker, self directed, open, have a growth mindset and be curious. In the creation of my work, it is important for me to be intentional by developing a clear story or focal point before I start to paint. In my execution, I need to be intentional with design, shapes, values and color. I need to focus on creating variety in my shapes, observe how all the shapes are connecting as a whole, and how they interact or relate to the other shapes in the painting. For me, to paint with intention is to show up fully, paying attention to what is going on around me and within me, and to connect with myself and my viewer and stay true to what I truly want to express.

The beauty is that my To Be list as an artist can also be carried over into my personal life by me being more curious, open, risk taking in my relationships and family life. Giving space for the qualities we would like to be known for instead of focusing on the outcome, helps us to live more intentionally in the world creating deeper meaning and lasting satisfaction.



RECEIVING:Saturday April 16 2022, 10AM--Noon at Clovis Veterans Memorial District, Veterans Room.Judging and Hanging will take place afterwards.

This is an Open Show. ALL SUBJECTS ARE WELCOME in any category except the Theme. Due to limited space, this show may be juried. Any winning entry may be used for publicity in the 2023 show.

CATEGORIES: Oils, Acrylics, Watercolors, Pastels, Drawing/Graphics, Mixed/Media, 3-D-art/Sculpture, SPECIAL THEME category: Old West, Rodeo and the Western Way of life. You may enter art in the special theme category "Old West & Rodeo", using any media from the seven open categories as long as the subject matter is the Old West, Rodeo or the Western Way of Life. Categories may be combined at the descretion of the Show Chairs.

ENTRY FEES are \$25.00 per art piece for non-members and \$20.00 per art piece for CAG members. Entry fees are non-refundable.

PRIZE MONEY: Cash prizes will be offered for Best of Show, First, Second, Third places. There must be 7 entries in a category to receive monetary awards. Honorable Mentions will be awarded ribbons. The Mary Krause Award, a special award for artwork showing a unique understanding of the principals of art. Categories with insufficent entries may be combined with another category for judging. People's Choice will be awarded at the close of the show.

RECEPTION / AWARD CEREMONY: Thursday, April 21st, 5:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m. Public is welcome. Awards will be given out this night. CAG does not mail out awards; they must be picked up in person. Please be there to accept your award!

ELIGIBILITY:The Old West show is open to all artists 18 years or older. Student Artists under 18 may enter the adult show, but must have a parent, Teacher or guardian's signature on the entry form. All entries must have been completed within the last three years. A signed and completed entry form must accompany each

LIABILITY: All show entries will be handled with the greatest care, but neither the Clovis Veterans Memorial District or the Clovis Art Guild will be held responsible for any loss or damage whatsoever to any entry, before, during or after the show. Artists should carry their own

EXHIBIT HOURS: Mon-Sat 10am-6pm, Sun 10am-4pm Artists entering the show should be prepared to sit as host/hostess or furnish a representative for at least one 3-hour segment during the show. Thank You.

ART PICKUP is Sunday, April 24th 4:00PM—5PM at the show location. Please be on time. Storage of your art not picked up from the show is not an option. If you cannot be present during art pickup, please make arrangements for someone else to pick up your art.

SALES are handled by the Artist. A 10% donation to CAG is customary and appreciated. Art may not be removed prior to the close of the show — 4:00 PM on Sunday, April 24th

UNACCEPTABLE ENTRIES: Artwork that has been done by any printing processes will not be accepted. Copies of another artists or photographer's work from postcards, art books, magazines or other printed material may not be entered. Art depicting famous people or celebrities must have written permission of the celebrity or famous person attached. Work created as a part of a class assignment may not be entered. No Nudity or graphic violence.

ENTRY RULES: Artists may enter no more than 3 entries per category and no more than 9 entries total.

Entries cannot have been shown in successive Clovis Art Guild juried shows. Independent work that has been critiqued by a professional or independent work done in a classroom environment is acceptable

Entries in combined categories will be judged against the standards for the original media.

<u>Drawing/Graphics</u> includes pencil, charcoal, colored pencil, Prisma-Color, markers, pen/ink and just about any medium that can be used to draw lines on paper.

Mixed Media: For art to be considered Mixed Media, all media used must be clearly visible.

3-D/Sculpture includes encaustic, glass, ceramic, and other sculpture media such as clay, wood, stone, paper, Bas-Relief, Assemblage, and Collage.

Oils must be completely dry. Watercolor, Pastels, graphics and some types of Mixed Media must be under glass, unless larger than 24" x 28" and then plexi-glass is required.

Frames must be in good repair and ready to hang.

There will be no repair table.

FRAMING: All paintings must be framed (gallery wrap 1.5—3" on the edge is acceptable). Use of metal frames is at the risk of the artist. Screws for hanging must be no more than 4" inches from the top of the frame and the wire must not show over the top of the frame. Please use flat hangers with wires only, no saw-tooth, eyelet hangers or quick frames and no screw eyes. The ends of the wire must be taped or sleeved with plastic. Unique or uncommon framing must pass inspection by the show chair. Please see the Professional Framing Standards Flyer posted on our website, www.clovisartquild.com.

SIZES ALLOWED: The maximum size including frame is 42" x 42", maximum weight 25 lbs. Artists entering sculptures or other 3-D media too large or too heavy to fit on a display table should provide their own pedestal.

MARY KRAUSE AWARD: Given to the artist who shows the best grasp of the principals of art.

GENE BUTLER SCHOLARSHIP ART SHOW: Open to Local Area High Schools. Please contact your teacher for information about the Gene Butler Student Scholarship. All scholarship entries should go through your high school art teacher. Please use the Professional Framing Standards Flyer posted on our website. www.clovisartguild.com.
