Artist Statement

I've always been creative, but it wasn't until I retired at 65, that I started developing as an artist. I'm consciously involved in creating art and boldly discovering what I kept inside for so many years. My art is mixed media collage, and Assemblage-found object sculpture. It's creating two and three dimensional compositions, putting together found objects, altered bits and pieces, along with my imagery. I revamp, up-cycle, and repurpose creating something magical,whimsical. Its taking something ordinary, worn or dilapidated, and reviving it into something extraordinary. It's developing a unique voice, hoping to draw an emotional response from the viewer. I've always been creative, but it wasn't until I turned 65, I took the bold move of completing my first assemblage and and a collage and entered these in the Fresno County Fine Arts Show. To my surprise, the assemblage received a 2nd Place award in Beginning Mixed Media, and the collage an Honorable Mention. I was thrilled and the experience gave me the courage to become an artist.
